Data sharing

Immo Trinks: We have been collecting a lot of geophysics data; is there the possibility of creating a database to share this data or even indicate where surveys have been undertaken?

Armin Schmidt: consider the already existing database, for example ADS in the UK (https://archaeologydataservice.ac.uk/) and tDAR in the US (https://core.tdar.org/search).

Natalie Pickartz: In some countries there are issues of data sharing (i.e. client confidentiality etc).

Roland Linck: Situation in Bavarian state department is that they are not allowed to share data.

Michal Pisz: Often sharing information should not be a problem as there is already much available, also through Google Earth/maps etc.

Maksym Mackiewicz: It's not always legal to handover data due to client ownership.

Armin Schmidt: Country specific versions do exist. Could they be unified through a single API?

Jeremy Menzer: tDAR has generalised information; for example it allows to upload just a polygon of an area. It can then be queried to find out who did the survey.

Immo Trinks: Could ISAP funds be used to test the feasibility of setting up an API?

Armin Schmidt: Yes, ISAP funds can be used for consultancy costs.

Joep Orbons: Perhaps could be fire-walled/password protected to be limited to ISAP members?

Kris Lockyear: Could look at the example of UK PAS (Portable Antiquities Scheme; https://finds.org.uk). Those who are registered have increased levels of access.

ISAP Proof-reading scheme

Michal Pisz: Please remember its existence. Eileen Ernenwein (current joint editor of Archaeological Prospection) has encouraged its use.
